Areas of Influence

Future of aerial survey in Europe!

ATC/ ATM:

Relationship EAASI – ATC Organisations:

Initiate and maintain a continuous relationship between the aerial surveying industry and ATC organizations all over Europe – both civilian and military;

Airspace Priority:

Build awareness among ATC organisations to the importance of providing priority airspace access for aerial-survey missions;

Permitting Procedures:

Identify and foster harmonisation of procedures for survey flight application (permission) and coordination all over Europe.

EASA Part-SPO Regulation:

- Identify issues and potential for improvement of Part-SPO regulation;
- Identify channels for influencing and participating in EASA Part-SPO regulatory WG's.

UAS development:

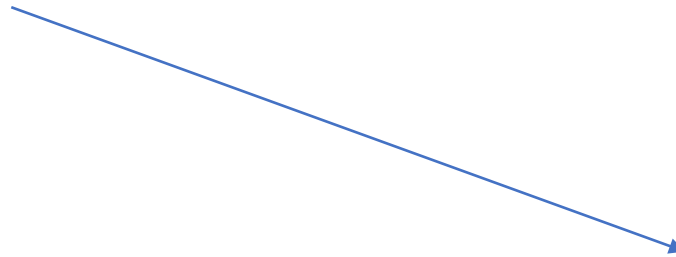
- Follow UAS development and its impact (priority) on airspace usage for manned aerial-survey missions.

Overarching elements

- Continue to survey the European “constellation” (Stakeholders);
- Survey of the members major “issues” and suggestions.
- Continuous PR (EAASI & AG2), spread the message, become a major POC/ actor/ reference;
- Continuous presence/ exchange within identified “groups”;
- Interaction with the members.

Questionnaire

- Answered: 9
- ATC/ ATM problems: 8/ 9
 - Countries mentioned: Austria, Italy, Czech Republic, France, UK, Eastern Europe in general, Netherlands.
 - Larger cities & military
 - During survey flights: 7/9
 - Permitting problems: 8/9
 - Permit specific issues: Poland, Italy, Spain, France, Eastern Europe, France, UK, Netherlands
- Reporting of specific events: 8/9 = yes

Suggestions for changes in regulation

- 4/9
- Raise understanding for the specific needs of aerial surveying;
- Central EU office coordinating aerial survey permits within EU;
- Provide an AOC instead of the Declaration;
- Harmonisation of High Risk Criteria;
- Cross border coordination;
 - Crossing borders between EU(European) Countries and NON-EU(European) countries should be easier and CAN be easier if clients/administration parts of countries at least speak with each other.
